IMPORTANT: The name on all of your documents must match the name in our database. If your name has changed since birth and does not match the documents you submit, you will also need to provide legal documents to justify all name changes. Such documents would include a marriage certificate, divorce decree, court ordered name change, adoption record, and/or Certificate of Naturalization.

Midlands Technical College reserves the right to request the review of additional original and/or supporting documentation.

PROOF OF U.S. CITIZENSHIP – PUT AN “X” BY YOUR CHOICE

- Valid South Carolina driver’s license, CDL, DMV-issued photo ID, or beginner’s permit
- Birth Certificate issued in the United States (with birth/file number and registrar’s signature) by an official state government agency AND a valid government-issued photo ID
- U.S. Passport; within 5 years of expiration
- Certificate of Naturalization or Certificate of Citizenship AND a valid government-issued photo ID
- U.S. government-issued Consular Report of Birth Abroad AND a valid government-issued photo ID
- Birth Certificate from a U.S. Territory (must be English translation) such as Puerto Rico, Guam, U.S. Virgin Islands, and American Samoa AND a valid government-issued photo ID
- Valid driver’s license or ID from the following states (if your state is not on this list, it is not eligible):
Alaska, Arizona, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine (issued after 11/15/08), Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, Montana, New Hampshire, New Jersey, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia, or Wisconsin.

By my signature below, I hereby attest and certify, under penalty of perjury, that I am a citizen of the United States. I understand that federal law makes it a crime, punishable by up to three years in prison, to falsely and willfully represent oneself to be a citizen of the United States.

- Resident Alien card issued before 1997
- Permanent Resident Card with photograph issued after 1997 (scans/copies of both front and back required)
- USCIS paperwork or valid immigration status
- DACA recipients must submit their unexpired Employment Authorization Documents.
